



# 2024 Civic Trust Awards, Pro Tem Awards, AABC Conservation Awards and Selwyn Goldsmith Awards for Universal Design Winners



The Civic Trust Awards scheme was established in 1959 to recognise outstanding architecture, planning and design in the built environment.

The Civic Trust Awards is not just about rewarding architecture or design excellence, successful projects should also exhibit strong sustainability credentials, a high level of accessible and universal design, whilst also demonstrating how the project has provided a positive civic contribution.

The Civic Trust Awards is unique and is recognised as the only 360-degree awards scheme in the world that promotes:

- Excellence in architecture and design standards
- Accessible and universal design
- Positive community impact
- Sustainable design & construction
- Consultation with user groups
- Innovation
- Social and economic renewal
- Localism
- Sustainable planning
- Sensitive conservation and restoration
- Designing in context
- Variety of entries including temporary buildings and structures

Since 1959, more than 7000 domestic and international projects have been recognised by the Civic Trust Awards. These range from small community projects to larger internationally recognised buildings, bridges, infrastructure, public realm, and public art. All schemes submitted for consideration are judged on their own merits and are subject to rigorous assessment.

The Civic Trust Awards is widely recognised within the industry as a mark of excellence for the architectural practice, the client, the developer, and all organisations involved in the projects development and delivery.

This year, from over 320 entries, 69 projects have been recognised. Submissions were received from across the UK, Canada, France, Germany, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, and USA, reflecting the awards' continuing international reach.

# 2024 Special Awards

Presented to schemes which have demonstrated truly outstanding work in a specific field.

All projects of National/International winning standard are considered for each of the Special Awards by National Judging Panel members who determine the individual winners.

- **National Panel Special Award**

Selected by National Judging Panel Members as the exemplar scheme from the year's Award-winning projects.

- **Special Award for Reuse & Adaptation**

Presented to an exceptional scheme that would otherwise be left to decay or be demolished to address present-day needs. - **Special Award for Education**
