The Outstanding Achievement Award - Selected by National Judging Panel Members as the exemplary scheme from the year’s Award-winning projects.

The Special Award for Sustainability - Presented to an exemplary project, that demonstrates excellent sustainability credentials in terms of overall design parameters, material selection, construction methods and long-term energy consumption. Sponsored by Derwent London.

The Special Award for Reuse & Adaptation - Presented to an exceptional cultural heritage restoration of a building or development of a culturally significant site, to address present-day needs. Sponsored by EPR Architects.

Special Award for Community Impact & Engagement - Presented to an exceptional scheme that has demonstrated how successful community engagement can help deliver the highest standards of design whilst meeting the needs of local people.

Michael Middleton Special Award - Presented as a memorial and tribute to Michael Middleton CBE, who established the Civic Trust Awards in 1959, to an outstanding restoration project or new build within a conservation area.
